## **Continual Christmas**

Matthew 1:23-- "The virgin will be with child and will give birth to a son, and they will call him Immanuel—which means, "God with us."

God is ever-present in our lives as the <u>Holy Spirit</u>, the "Jiminy Cricket" of our minds, our conscience, so we are guided in His path, the way of truth and light. He nudges us toward the right choices, toward doing good even if surrounded by temptations and difficulties, sorrows and sins. # "Silent Night"

#### Psalm 89:5 "The heavens praise your wonders, LORD, your faithfulness too..."

When I was in sixth grade, I'd ride my bike to my nearest neighbor-friend's house to visit and play, escaping my two older siblings and baby brother for a short while. My classmate Pam Powell had an older brother, too, but hers was in the army, serving in Germany. She was so excited when he came home on leave that she invited me to meet him. I pedaled my bike quickly down the remote country road, anxious to see why he was so special. With an infectious smile and engaging personality, he was sweet and kind to us preteen girls, and he patiently taught us the German words to my favorite Christmas carol, "Silent Night." I remember the harsh foreign words choking in the back of my mouth (-CHT), the S sounding like SH, the W a V, and his laughter at our attempts. He was patient and persevering, not giving up until we had mastered the beautiful song: "Stille Nacht, heilige Nacht! Alles schläft; einsam wacht. Nur das traute hochheilige Paar. Holder Knabe im lockigen Haar, Schlaf in himmlischer Ruh! Schlaf in himmlischer Ruh!" It still is imprinted on my memory.

We all know the legend of how the church organist Franz Gruber set young Pastor Joseph Mohr's poem to music with his simple three-chord guitar accompaniment to "save" the Christmas Eve Midnight Mass service when the pipe organ was broken, but we might not know how the classic carol first performed that snowy night as a duet by the musician and his minister in the remote village near Salzburg, Austria in 1818 survived. First, the organ repairman, Karl Mauracher,

begged Gruber to give him a copy, then arranged a four-part version for the Strasser children, a singing quartet who performed it at the Leipzig Fair where the Director-General of Music, Mr. Pohlenz, heard them and arranged for them to sing for the king and queen at the Pleissenburg Castle on Christmas Eve 1832. King Frederick William IV of Prussia heard a rendition 22 years later, expressing his wish that it be given first place in all Christmas concerts in his domain. Finally, Rev. Byron Underwood, a Massachusetts rector, published an article in *The Hymn* in Oct. 1937 recognizing the Episcopalian bishop Rev. John Freeman Young as the translator who created the version of "Silent Night" that we know (~Emurian, Ernest K. *Stories of Christmas Carols*, pp. 105-112).

Five men and four children are responsible for giving us this precious holiday standard that we sing at every Christmas Eve service holding our shining candles high in tribute to Christ, our beloved babe born humbly in a manger centuries ago.

The message of "Silent Night" is still poignant and perfect for these troubled times: peace is a dream, a hope, a Christmas wish which the birth of baby Jesus fulfills. And a young Virginian fresh from serving in a divided Germany after WWII calmly taught his sister and her friend the original version of this beautiful Christmas favorite thereby opening their worlds to the universal theme: peace is possible on both sides of the ocean, harmony can be more than a dream in every community, goodwill begins in each heart, each home. Holy, holy, holy love.

Dear Heavenly Father—Thank you for the birth and example of your Son, our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ. May we cherish the peace he bestows upon us as we worship him as "love's pure light," holding tight to the lessons we are still learning of your redeeming grace and the "glories streaming from heaven afar." As the peace of a silent night hopefully embraces us and our country, "with the angels, let us sing, Alleluia to our King." And may we all "sleep in heavenly peace." Thank you for this wondrous gift of faith, this light of love shining in our hearts. Amen.
