#### A Note from the Pastor

It may seem like a small thing, but where you sit on Sunday morning matters!

Interesting, isn't it? When we go to a concert, play, or sports event, we want to be as close to the action as possible. We're even willing to pay top dollar for it! (A front row seat at this year's Super Bowl will cost you upwards of \$10,000 a ticket). Yet, when it comes to worship, for some reason, everyone wants to sit in the back.

The past several Sundays, I've been inviting you to move forward, because where you sit matters. . .

It matters to those watching us on Live Stream. One of our shut-ins shared with me that she watches via livestream and the church looks empty. She tunes in wanting to feel part of the congregation, hoping, at least, catch a glimpse of her friends, and instead she sees an "empty" sanctuary.

It matters to those looking for a church family. Nowadays, many people will visit a church online before ever showing up in person. When they tune into one of our services (live or recorded), they too see an empty sanctuary.

It matters to people who may be running late. It's frustrating enough to be running late for something. But when you realize that you've got to walk in front of 70some people, it can be downright embarrassing. Many people would rather not take that "walk of shame" and simply go home. However, saving a few easy-to-get-to spots in the back can make a difference. (Additional note: It's also helpful to sit towards the center of the pew rather than closest to the aisle).

It matters to parents of small children and people with medical needs. People with small children or medical needs often prefer the back because they never know when they'll need to make a quick exit. And nobody wants the congregation watching as they drag their two-year-old down the aisle. And nobody wants everyone to know when they need to make multiple trips to the restroom. (The above note about sitting towards the center of the pew applies here as well.)

It matters to the pastor and worship leader. I'll go ahead and admit it. It matters to me. (I can't speak for Karl and Kristin, but I suspect it's true for them as well). When I was involved in theater, I was always amazed at the difference having an audience makes. It's the same on Sunday morning. It makes a big difference to us when we can hear you participating. It makes a difference when we can make eye contact with you. But when there's a large gulf between us, it certainly makes it more difficult.

So where you sit matters!

Let me close with an experience my friend Dave had once. He was reading and praying through the book of Revelation and he was reflecting on the great multitude of worshippers that surround God's throne. He found. himself wondering where he would be in that great crowd. He felt God say to his spirit "The same place you are Sunday Morning."


