<u>A Note from the Pastor</u>

Unless you plan to send Priscilla Presley a birthday card, May 24th is not likely a day you have marked on your calendar. But it's a day that's important in Methodist history.

John Wesley is credited with being the founder of the Methodist church. John was born in 1703 as one of 19 children. Although John was born into a clergy family, John struggled to find peace with God. Even though John was ordained by the Church of England, he knew something was missing from his faith. He would describe himself in his journals as having "A fair summer religion." His faith served him well only as long as things were easy, but John would write, "let death look me in the face, and my spirit is troubled."

John (and his brother, Charles) agreed to serve as missionaries to the Georgia colony. During the ocean crossing, their ship was caught in a terrible storm. John was terrified but noticed a group of Moravian Christians praying and praising God peacefully during the storm. He wondered how they could have such peace. Unfortunately, the Georgia mission did not go well, and both John and Charles returned London after only a few months. John would write in his journal "I went to America to convert the Indians, but, Oh, who will convert me?"

On May 24, 1738, John very reluctantly went to a church service held somewhere on Aldersgate Street in London. Here's how he described what happened that day:

[On May 24, 1738] in the evening, I went very unwillingly to a society in Aldersgate Street, where one was reading Luther's preface to the epistle to the Romans. While he was describing the change which God works in the heart through faith in Christ, I felt my heart strangely warmed. I felt I did trust in Christ, Christ alone for salvation; and an assurance was given me that He had taken away my sins, even mine, and saved me from the law of sin and death. John wanted others to know the peace, love, and joy that he had found. He began to speak, preach, and teach, calling people to a deep personal faith.

As May 24th comes near, perhaps, it would do us all well to ask ourselves a few questions:

1) Has my heart ever been "strangely warmed?"

2) Do I truly trust in Christ, or do I trust that I will be good enough?

I would suggest spending some time this month reflecting on what we call the Wesleyan Covenant prayer, written by John.

"God, I am no longer my own, but yours. Put me to what you will, place me with whom you will.

Put me to doing, put me to suffering. Let me be put to work for you or set aside for you, praised for you or criticized for you. Let me be full, let me be empty. Let me have all things, let me have nothing. I freely and fully surrender all things to your glory and service. In Jesus' name, amen."
