# <u>A Note from the Pastor</u>

Journalists recognize a good sound bite when they hear one. Most interviewees ramble on a bit, but eventually, they say something that answers the question at hand succinctly, meaningfully, and memorably. If you don't give them at least one or two memorable quotes, chances are you won't make it on the air.

This fall, we will be exploring Paul's letter to the Philippians. This letter is filled with memorable sound bites. Each one is packed with significant power and truth. They've been quoted, memorized, and stitched onto pillows for years!

Just listen to some of them:

 $\Box$  1:6- being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus.

 $\hfill\square$  1:21- For me to live is Christ and to die is gain.

 $\Box$  1:27- Only let your manner of life be worthy of the gospel.

 $\Box$  2:3-4- Do nothing out of selfish ambition or conceit, but in humility count others more significant than yourselves. Let each of you look not only to your own interests but also to the interests of others.

□ 2:5-11- Have the same mindset as Christ Jesus: Who, being in very nature God, did not consider equality with God something to be used to his own advantage; rather, he made himself nothing by taking the very nature of a servant, being made in human likeness. And being found in appearance as a man, he humbled himself by becoming obedient to death— even death on a cross! Therefore, God exalted him to the highest place and gave him the name that is above every name, that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, in heaven and on earth and under the earth, and every tongue acknowledge that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father.

 $\Box$  2:12-13- Work out your own salvation with fear and trembling for it is God who works in you.

 $\Box$  3:13-14-One thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus.

□ 4:4- Rejoice in the Lord always! Again, I say rejoice.

 $\Box$  4:6-7- Do not be anxious about anything. But in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and minds in Christ Jesus.

□ 4:8-Finally, Brothers and Sisters, whatever is true, whatever is honorable . . . think on these things.

 $\Box$  4:13- I can do all things through Christ who gives me strength.

Not bad for four chapters!

It's my hope that as we journey through Philippians together these familiar verses will take on new meaning and power in our lives.

## Advent Devotional

It has been a yearly tradition at Pine Street to create our own Advent/Christmas Devotional. I know you have found it meaningful to share words of encouragement and to read words of encouragement from fellow Pine Streeters. In order to keep this tradition alive, we need your help. Consider this an invitation to write a short devotional to be shared as part of our Advent/Christmas devotional for 2023.

This year our Advent theme will be "Sing we now of Christmas." We will be focusing on the meanings and stories of familiar Christmas carols. There's certainly plenty to reflect on. You could write a devotional based on a word or phrase from your favorite Christmas carol. Maybe you've always heard a deeper meaning in one of the secular Christmas songs. Perhaps you could share with us a memory about a favorite carol. Another option would be to explore some of the songs that Luke associates with the first Christmas. We want you to feel free to write as God leads, even it means going in a different direction and doesn't fit the theme. If you need some additional support or resources, I, Pastor James, will be happy to share my library with you. Each devotional should be 150 - 200 words and include: a Scripture verse, a title if you have one, the devotional content, a short closing prayer, and the author's name. We'd like to have a rough idea of how many writers we will have, so if you would like to participate, please let us know by October  $15^{\text{th}}$ . You do not need to tell us what you are writing about, but if you would like to write for a specific date, please let us know that as well. We will do our best to honor those requests.

We would like to have the devotionals in hand by November 4<sup>th</sup> to allow enough time for compiling and printing before the first Sunday of Advent (December 3rd). The best way to submit your devotion is via email to pastor@pinestreetumc.org. Please, if possible, submit your devotional as a MS Word document with "Advent Devotional" in the subject line. While email is the preferred method of submission, we can also accept paper copies if needed.

#### Praying For Pine Street with the Apostle Paul

Each month, we're featuring one of the prayers the Apostle Paul prayed over his churches. We invite you to allow his prayers to shape and inform your prayers for Pine Street, others and even yourself. Try praying the passage itself, making Paul's prayer your own by slightly paraphrasing it to insert either your name, the names of others or Pine Street Church. Pray through the full prayer several times, covering various persons and groups, and adjusting the pronouns as needed.


