A Note from the Pastor

The month of January is named after one of the lesser-known Roman gods: Janus. Janus was considered to be the god of doors, gates, and transitions. Janus is usually depicted with two faces, one facing the past and one facing the future. It's fairly easy to see how Janus and January become connected. As the New Year dawns, we can't help but reflect on the year that has passed (the goals we accomplished, the failures we'd rather forget about), while looking ahead to the future and resolving that next year will be better.

Even though we as Christians don't subscribe to the Roman gods such as Janus, it's still wise for us to engage in a bit of reflection. The Bible encourages us to do exactly this:

Look carefully then how you walk, not as unwise but as wise, making the best use of the time, because the days are evil. Therefore, do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is. (Eph. 5:15–17)

Consider your ways. You have sown much and harvested little. You eat, but you never have enough, you drink, but you never have your fill. You clothe yourselves, but no one is warm. And he who earns wages does so to put them into a bag with holes. Thus says the LORD of hosts: Consider your ways. (Hag. 1:5–7)

Walk in wisdom toward outsiders, making the best use of the time. (Col. 4:5)

So here are a few questions to help you as you reflect.

Looking back:

- Where or when did I feel closest to God this past year?
- Where or when did I feel farthest from God?
- What were my greatest joys?
- > What were my greatest disappointments?
- How did God use me this year for his kingdom?
- Did I miss or refuse any opportunities from God?

Looking Ahead:

- > What am I excited about in 2024?
- > What am I nervous about?
- > What is one thing I could do this year to increase my enjoyment of God?
- > What is one thing God is calling me to do as we start the New Year?

If anything emerged during this activity that you would like to discuss with me, please know that I am

here for you. I'm more than willing to suggest books, resources, or spiritual disciplines. I'm happy just

to listen and pray with you.

May God bless us all as we seek Him in 2024.

5 things to pray in the New Year

1. For a New experience of God's Love

Because of the Lord's great love, we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail.

They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness.

(Lam 3:23).

2. For a New Song of Joy

I waited patiently for the LORD; he turned to me and heard my cry. He lifted me out of the slimy pit, out of the mud and mire; he set my feet on a rock and gave me a firm place to stand. He put a new song in my mouth, a hymn of praise to our God. Many will see and fear and put their trust in the LORD. Blessed is the man who makes the LORD his trust, who does not look to the proud, to those who turn aside to false gods. (Psa. 40:1-4).

3. For a New Heart

Rid yourselves of all the offenses you have committed, and get a new heart and a new spirit. Why will you die, O house of Israel? For I take no pleasure in the death of anyone, declares the Sovereign LORD. Repent and live! (Ez 18: 31-32) I will give you a new heart and put a new spirit in you; I will remove from you your heart of stone and give you a heart of flesh. And I will put my Spirit in you and move you to follow my decrees and be careful to keep my laws.,

(Ez 36;26-27)

4. For a New Sincerity

Your boasting is not good. Don't you know that a little yeast works through the whole batch of dough? Get rid of the old yeast that you may be a new batch without yeast —as you really are. For Christ, our Passover lamb, has been sacrificed. Therefore let us keep the Festival, not with the old yeast, the yeast of malice and wickedness, but with bread without yeast, the bread of sincerity and truth.

(1 Cor 5:6-8).

5. For the grace to cultivate New Attitudes

You were taught, with regard to your former way of life, to put off your old self, which is being corrupted by its deceitful desires; to be made new in the attitude of your minds; and to put on the new self, created to be like God in true righteousness and holiness. (Eph 4:22-24)


OFFERING ENVELOPES FOR 2024 HAVE ARRIVED. THEY ARE AVAILABLE IN THE LOBBY.
